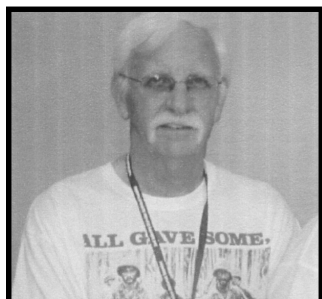

COMMENTS AND UPDATES FROM THE SECRETARY

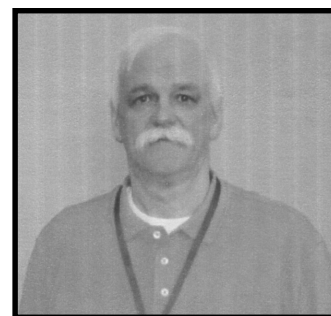
Well it's that time again to connect with you all. Another reunion has come and gone as of this newsletter.

LIBERATION CELEBRATION**PILSEN, CZECH REPUBLIC**

With WWII in Europe almost over May 1, 1945, V Corps, including 2nd ID, was transferred to 3rd Army and entered the western part of CZ. Most of the Division stopped at Pilsen – 9th Infantry went about 10 miles further, to the town, Rokycany. The Czechs welcomed us as liberators after years of Nazi occupation. Scheduled for Pacific, we left in about a month and all US troops left in November. Russia occupied the country as had been previously decided. 44 years of communist government followed. Russia attempted to erase all evidence that Americans had been there, including confiscation of any such photos.

June 1989, I was with a group 2nd ID vets (seven were MANCHUS) on a three week tour (retracing our 1944-45 footsteps) and spent two nights in Pilsen. The city was drab, unprogressive, and people seemed subdued.

Six months later, December 1989, the Berlin Wall (Iron Curtain) fell. May 1990, the 45th year anniversary of their liberation by us from the Nazis, Pilsen held their first annual celebration of their freedom. They have done so, every year since. This year, my daughter, her husband and I went. Veterans treated like celebrities, we had a great time the entire four day Celebration. Next day, I visited Rokycany, met the Mayor, saw some landmarks remembered from 1945 – very enjoyable.

Gary Sinise

For nearly forty years, Gary Sinise has stood as an advocate of America's service members. It began in the early 80's with his support of Vietnam Veterans groups and the creation of Vets Night, a program offering free dinners and performances to veterans at the Steppenwolf Theatre in Chicago. His commitment continued into the 90's working on behalf of the Disabled American Veterans organization which he continues to actively support. Since the attacks of September 11th, 2001, his dedication to our nation's active duty defenders, veterans and first responders has become a tireless crusade of support, service and gratitude to all those who protect our freedom and serve our country.

His portrayal of Lt. Dan Taylor in the landmark film *Forrest Gump* formed an enduring connection with servicemen and women throughout the military community. After several USO handshake tours in 2003, Sinise formed the "Lt. Dan Band" in early 2004 and began entertaining troops serving at home and abroad. The band now performs close to 30 shows a year for military bases, charities and fundraisers supporting wounded heroes, Gold Star families, veterans and troops around the world.

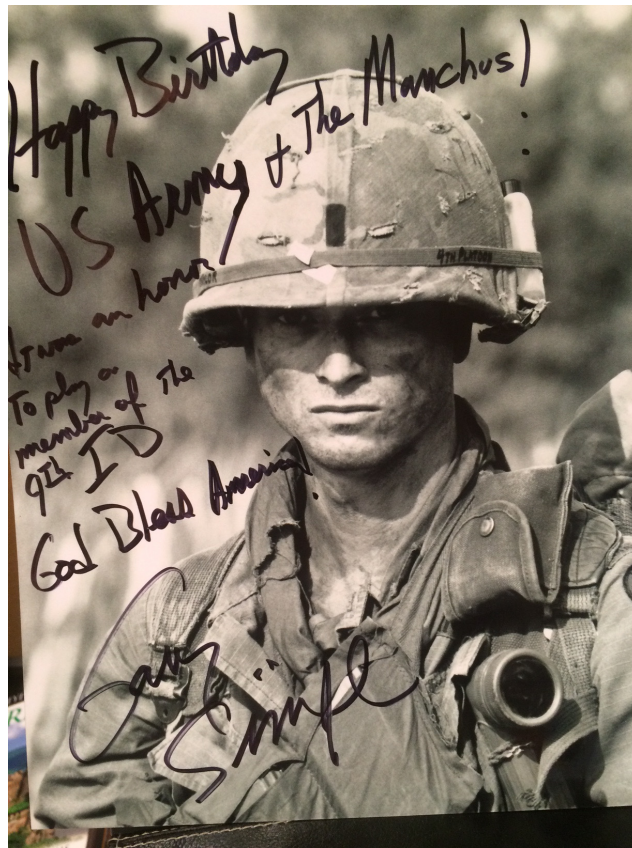
In recognition of his humanitarian work on behalf of our nation's defenders, Sinise has earned many distinguished awards including the Bob Hope Award for Excellence in Entertainment from the Medal of Honor Society, the Spirit of the USO Award, the Ellis Island Medal of Honor, the Doughboy Award, the Sylvanus Thayer Award, and the Dwight D. Eisenhower Award from the National Defense Industrial Association. In 2008, he received the Presidential Citizens Medal, the second-highest civilian honor awarded to citizens for exemplary deeds performed in service of the nation. In 2012, Sinise was presented with the Spirit of Hope Award by the Department of Defense, was named an honorary Chief Petty Officer by the United States Navy and in 2013 was pinned as an honorary Marine by General James Amos, commandant of the United States Marine Corp.

In 2011, to expand upon his individual efforts, Sinise established the Gary Sinise Foundation. Its mission is to serve and honor our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families and those in need by creating and supporting unique programs that entertain, educate, inspire, strengthen and build communities. Of its many outreach efforts, the Gary Sinise Foundation is building custom Smart Homes for severely wounded veterans, serving hearty meals to deploying troops and hosting spirit-boosting festivals for patients, families and medical staff at military hospitals.

VA plans to expand benefits eligibility for camp Lejeune veterans

We are including this article is some of the Agent Orange veterans have served a Camp Lejeune. People living in this United States Marine Corps base in North Carolina from the 1950s through the 1980s have been exposed to drinking water contaminated with industrial solvents, benzene, and other chemicals. This chemical exposure may have led to various health conditions.

Following discussions between health experts in the veterans health administration the Department of Health and human services agency for toxic substances and disease Registry VA secretary McDonald propose a rule that will create a presumption of service connection for certain health conditions associated with exposure to contaminated water at Camp Lejeune these presumptions will make it easier for effective veterans to receive VA disability compensation and health care.

"The water at Camp Lejeune was a hidden hazard, and it is only years later that we now know how dangerous it was," said Sec. McDonald. "We thank him and ATSDR for a thorough review to provided much of the evidence we needed to fully compensate veterans who develop one of the conditions known to be related to exposure to the compounds in the drinking water.

Once finalized, the proposed rule will expand benefits eligibility for veterans, members of the reserves, and members of the National Guard who were assigned to Camp Lejeune from August 1, 1953 through December 31, 1987.

Veteran who served as at Lejeune for 30 days or more between these dates are already eligible to receive VA health care for up to 15 health conditions. More information is available at the <http://go.usa.gov/cuxEA>.
